Dear Parishioners and Friends of our parish, we are so happy that you could join us today to celebrate The Twenty Ninth Sunday in Ordinary time.

Prayer should become woven into the fabric of our heart-beat and our breathing. With every breath, we can lift our hearts to God as our help, our consolation, our thanksgiving in the midst of decision-making. We are constantly in some phase of choosing and deciding in our daily lives, but prayer, "lifting our hearts and minds to God," can become so second-nature to us that it does not even feel tiring.

It is just "who we are." Mahatma Gandhi once wrote, "I am neither a man of letters nor of science, but I humbly claim to be a man of prayer. It is prayer that has saved my life. Without it I would have lost my reason long ago. If I did not lose my peace of soul, in the midst of my many trials, it is because of the peace that came to me through prayer." We can pray mentally and silently,

or out loud with the family at meals, use a Rosary, or hold a prayer circle with friends. We can pray on the telephone. We can keep a journal and write down our cries of pain, our happiness, our hurts and our hopes as prayers.

We can sing, we can chant in Latin or any language, we can play an instrument to God without singing or saying a word. Reading the Scriptures is always a valuable and comforting way to pray. But prayer often happens at the deepest level when we simply allow ourselves to become aware of what we are doing in the moment. This "prayer without words" can be very deep if we finally give up all control, and just rest in God's presence.

We are at our best when we quit overworking in our efforts to solve problems, and instead, simply trust ourselves as empty vessels to be filled with God's presence.

Go in peace to love and serve our God!


Annual Vocations Mass
