
Jesus was passing through Jericho, and Zacchaeus "was seeking to see who Jesus was." So he climbed a sycamore tree to get a better view. What did he see from up there? A man covered with dust, hair blown around by the wind, talking to his friends, and paying no attention to him. Then, suddenly, Jesus looked up at him.

What did Zacchaeus see? He saw eyes filled with welcome and acceptance, sparkling with humour, eyes that warmed him through and through. Eyes that cut to the chase, that saw many hidden things... eyes that touched his deepest heart. But suddenly, in those eyes of Jesus, Zacchaeus felt a spark of hope-and that spark burst into a flame of joy.

Without knowing why, he felt accepted and loved. Jesus invited him: "Come down quickly, Zacchaeus....For today I must stay at your house." What do I do today if I want to see Jesus? I might look at a holy picture or an icon or statue... I might go to church, see a crucifix, or have a powerful experience in prayer...

But most likely, I will find Jesus in the eyes of another: A friend who comforts me in my loss, or shares my disappointment, understands my upset, or someone who just accepts me as they find me-even though I think I'm "a mess."

They accept me as I am right now. Then we have found Jesus in another: "God with skin on."

November the Month of the Holy Souls

The month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. The Holy Mass will be offered throughout the month of November for all our beloved dead, family and friends. The Society of the Divine Saviour - SDS (The Salvatorians)

The Founder of the Salvatorians, the Servant of God, Blessed Francis Mary of the Cross Jordan. He was born 16th June 1848, in the poor, rural family in Gurtweil, the archidiocese of Freiburg. At the age of 30, he was ordined a priest. As a seminarian, he felt that God was called him to found the Church's apostolic work by fully engaging in the apostolic mission of the Church with the help of all possible ways and means. In Rome he founded the Apostolic Teaching Society on 8th December 1881, which eventually turned into a religious institute called the Society of the Divine Saviour. On 8th December 1888, with the help and and participation of the Blessed Mary of the Apostles, he founded a female branch of the Assembly, called the Salvatorian Sisters. The purpose of the Society is to strengthen, to defend and to spread the Catholic faith everywhere in so far as this is committed to it by Divine Providence. Therefore, by exercising this ecclesiastical teaching function in word and writing, it intends to achieve the end that all people might know more and more the one true God and Him whom He sent, Jesus Christ (Rule from 1882). The Polish Province: Poland is amongst the 42 countries where Salvatorians are workig. The frst Salvatorians arrived in Poland 1900. The Polish Province was founded in 1927, and has since grown to over 470 members, which is more than on-third of the total Society. The members of the Province are involved in the following apostolic works: parish work, pastoral care at the foreign missions, parish missions and retreats, apostolic work within the mass-media, spiritual formation, academic teaching at the universities, pastoral youth ministry, apostolic work abroad, pastoral work with Polish people abroad, work in hospices, chaplaincy for religious sisters and brothers, and chaplaincy in hospitals, schools and military units. Currently the members of the Polish Province are present in 22 countries of the world. In the UK we work in close cooperation with Salvatorians of the British Pro-Province. Through all the ways of working succesfully in the apostolate,

On behalf of all the volunteers at Starter Packs in Perth I would like to say a huge Thank You to those of you who have previously supported us those and who continue to do so. Starter packs is a charity run solely by volunteers which provides packs containing basic household items such as pots, pans, crockery, cutlery, towels, toiletries, bedding etc to low income and previously homeless individuals and families who have been given a new tenancy in the Perth and Kinross area.

We also provide kettles, toasters and slow cookers when they are donated or when funding allows. Most of the contents of our packs are good quality used items which are donated by members of the local community. Cash donations are used to supplement our packs when there is a shortfall and to pay for the running of our unit where we store the goods and make up the packs. If you wish to donate to Starter Packs our unit is open between 10am and 12noon Tuesday and Friday. Though arrangements can be made to receive donations at another time.
