Dear Parishioners and Friends of our parish, we are so happy that you could join us today to celebrate the Sunday of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

Today we honour Christ as King. He is king of many things, in fact of all things, but today let us think about Christ as King of light. His kingdom is a kingdom filled with light, and all who are a part of this kingdom are called children of the light. Our second reading declares that the Father, "...has taken us out of the power of darkness and created a place for us in the kingdom of the Son that he loves."

Light is a purifying agent. Just as sunlight bleaches out stains, Christ's light purifies the parts of our lives we may avoid looking at-such as, how well we take care of our physical and mental health, our use of money, care of the needy. This is not to saddle us with unnecessary guilt, but merely to encourage us to live fuller, richer lives - lives that can stand being in the light. It is highly possible that some of us might be hiding some part of our lives from the light-some part we would rather keep in darkness. We don't say that kind of thing to ourselves. We don't see ourselves as people who are out to deceive others.

But, at the same time, there might be some hidden feelings, desires, or thoughts that we just never bring into the light. Maybe we don't even look at that part of ourselves, and that's why it is still in the darkness. Sometimes we hear that the purpose of life is to build God's kingdom. That's true in one way, but the deeper truth is that we are already living in God's Kingdom: the Kingdom of Light and of Love is here. Staying in the darkness is not an option.

We pray that we will, more and more, allow God's light into our lives and bring God's light to others.

22 November Memorial of St Cecilia

Saint Cecilia lived in the second centry and tradition says she died about 177 AD. Cecilia was born in a wealthy Roman family and was a Christian by birth. Her family gave her in marriage to Valerius, a pagan nobleman. Cecilia promised to remain a virgin, and she was successful in persuading Valerius to respect her virginity on their wedding night.

Later, Valerius was converted to Catholicism along with his brother, Tiburtius. These two brothers dedicated themselves to burying the Christian martyrs, which was illegal. They were arrested and sentenced to death for refusing to renounce their religion. Cecilia continued the work of converting people to the Christian faith and of burying the Christian dead, even though it was against the law. Hundreds were baptized through her witness and strength of faith. Her refusal to worship false gods and her burying of the dead lead to her arrest.

Saint Cecilia was brought to trial and sentenced to death. It took several days for her to die, and it is said that she converted many people who came to care for her as she was dying. Saint Cecilia was buried in the Catacomb of Saint Callistus.

She is remembered today as the patron of musicians, composers, instrument makers, and poets. There is a story that Saint Cecilia was said to have heard heavenly music inside her heart when she was forced to marry the pagan Valerian. During her wedding, Cecilia sat and sang to God in her heart. Thus, she was declared to be the patron of musicians. Musical compositions, poems, art, and festivals have grown out of this story. Saint Cecilia reminds us of the ways that our music and art can lead us to praise God.
