Dear Parishioners and Friends of our parish, we are so happy that you could join us today to celebrate the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Lack of hope, or despair, can create a living hell for people. When we find ourselves in a personal situation of darkness where we feel trapped and are unable to imagine any way out, then despair has a strangle-hold on us. And in the midst of despair, people act in harmful and even dangerous ways. How many times do we hear of a parent, caught up in despair, taking the lives of his whole family, then turning the gun on himself?

Believing in a God of light and hope means that no matter how dark our darkness, the light is always and forever much stronger and brighter, even if we personally can't see our way out of our troubling situation. Besides the hope that we all have as individuals, we need to nourish the hope that comes from being a part of a worldwide community of believers. We need each other if we are not going to slip into despair in the face of the death and destruc-

tion we find so easily in our world today. We all know from instinct and from experience that two heads are better than one, and if we want to stretch that image, four heads are better than two, and eight heads are better than four, and so on.

So much has been accomplished in our world, when people, who have hope, join with other people of hope, and decide to put their hope into action. As Catholics, we are spread over the entire earth. That is one of our great strengths. We are a Catholic, universal, body of Christian believers. But we need to have connections with one another here at the local level. Every parish is a community of communities. We need to know the names of some of our community members and look into the faces of our fellow believers. Please consider joining with others to bring Christ's hope to those who are sitting in the darkness.

The Story of the Conversion of St Paul

Saint Paul's entire life can be explained in terms of one experience—his meeting with Jesus on the road to Damascus. In an instant, he saw that all the zeal of his dynamic personality was being wasted, like the strength of a boxer swinging wildly. Perhaps he had never seen Jesus, who was only a few years older. But he had acquired a zealot's hatred of all Jesus stood for, as he began to harass the Church: "...entering house after house and dragging out men and women, he handed them over for imprisonment" (Acts 8:3b).

Now he himself was "entered," possessed, all his energy harnessed to one goal—being a slave of Christ in the ministry of reconciliation, an instrument to help others experience the one Savior. One sentence determined his theology: "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting" (Acts 9:5b). Jesus was mysteriously identified with people—the loving group of people Saul had been running down like criminals. Jesus, he saw, was the mysterious fulfillment of all he had been blindly pursuing.

Paul's life became a tireless proclaiming and living out of the message of the cross: Christians die baptismally to sin and are buried with Christ; they are dead to all that is sinful and unredeemed in the world. They are made into a new creation, already sharing Christ's victory and someday to rise from the dead like him.

So Paul's great message to the world was: You are saved entirely by God, not by anything you can do. Saving faith is the gift of total, free, personal and loving commitment to Christ, a commitment that then bears fruit in more "works" than the Law could ever contemplate.
