Dear Parishioners and Friends of our parish, we are so happy that you could join us today to celebrate the 2nd Sunday of Lent.

Death, and taxes, and many things in between terrify us every day of our lives. All of us live with some degree of anxiety, fatigue, or depression. This makes trusting God very difficult-too much can go wrong!

But even those closest to Jesus weren't quick to trust. In the gospel today, Jesus frightens the apostles with quite an other-worldly experience. First, they see Jesus blindingly transformed by light. Then they see Jesus talking with two ancient prophets, who had been dead for over 1000 years! Peter was speechless, and it says "They were terrified."

But Jesus doesn't rush to comfort or reassure them, because he knows that they don't yet see the whole picture-they are terrified only because they do not yet believe they can trust the unknown to God. The answer to all of our stress and worry lies in God's own

words today: "This is My Beloved Son-listen to him!" First, we might have to add "Stop" and "Look." Stop the inner chatter, and the outer noise, just for a while.

Look, really look with time and focus and attention, at the person talking to you, the task at hand, the cat in your lap. Now, you can Listen: Listening is a decision to receive with open hands whatever God is giving you. Jesus did not explain every detail to the apostles, because he knew that the God of all life was trustworthy-and that is enough, for them, and for us. Yes, we will have fears, because there is evil in the world. But Jesus trusted God with the deepest and most vulnerable places of his heart. If we listen, Jesus will teach us how to trust that way.

Great Lent – Follow His Footsteps back to the Garden Of Eden

The story of Adam and Eve's expulsion from the Garden of Eden is a powerful reminder that peace and joy can only be found when we live in the presence of God. Since losing our privilege to live in the very presence of the living God in the Garden of Eden, everything we do, desire and dream of is a cry and attempt to find and restore the lost joy and peace of paradise. Therefore, everything we do, everything we want is a mere subconscious attempt to find our way back to the Garden of Eden. Our Lord and Saviour through His incarnation, crucifixion and death came to restore our communion with God and the rightful place in the Garden of Eden. Following His footsteps is the only sure way for us to find our way back home, to our heavenly father's comforting presence and end the desperate attempts of our souls trying to find hope, peace and joy in places where they can't be found.

Challenge - Reflect on the ways in which Christ's life and teachings offer a path back to the Garden of Eden. This could involve study-

ing scripture, meditating on Christ's example, or seeking guidance from a spiritual mentor.

Practice humility and repentance - Recognize your own limitations and weaknesses, and seek God's forgiveness for any shortcomings or mistakes you may have made. Practice compassion and love towards others. Follow Christ's example by caring for the marginalized, standing up for justice, and offering a helping hand to those in.

Take action to heal relationships and reconcile with others. Reach out to those you may have hurt, seek forgiveness, and work towards building bridges of understanding and reconciliation. Finally, as you approach Easter, reflect on the ways in which you have grown and the progress you've made towards finding your way back to the Garden of Eden. Celebrate the small steps you've taken and continue to seek God's guidance and grace in your journey.
