Dear Parishioners and Friends of our parish, we are so happy that you could join us today to celebrate the 3rd Sunday of Easter.

There are some questions in life that we have to ask over and over again. I don't mean questions like, "How come you didn't put out the garbage?" Or "Are you ever going to fix that squeaky door?", although you also might have to ask those questions over and over again. The kind of questions I'm talking about are on a deeper and more personal level. These are the kinds of questions that can't just be answered once. One of those questions, which we always need to ask as followers of Jesus, is this: how is my life of worship connected to the rest of my life? Isn't this the same question in which unbelievers are also interested?

When those who don't believe or who are weak in their faith see how we live our lives, they wonder how our life of worship and prayer is connected to our daily lives. In fact, at times, their question is crucial to their own lives. They might be searching for a different way to live their own lives. They might be on the edge of coming to a belief in God or in Jesus, or in once again coming back to full participation in the Christian community. But they need the concrete witness of those who believe in Jesus.

They need to see that the way we live our lives is consistent with what we believe and with how we worship. Today we are given that surprising and remarkable story of Jesus appearing to the two disciples as they make their journey home. At first he is just a stranger, but they come to recognize him as he breaks bread with him. And then they remark that their hearts were burning as he opened the Scripture to them. Jesus shared the Sacred Word and the Sacred Bread with them. It was clearly a story of the Eucharist -- the breaking and sharing of the Word and the Bread. The Eucharist is not merely an expression of communion in the Church's life; it is also a project of

solidarity for all of humanity. In the celebration of the Eucharist the Church constantly renews her awareness of being a 'sign and instrument' not only of intimate union with God but also of the unity of the whole human race.

The Christian who takes part in the Eucharist learns to become a promoter of communion, peace and solidarity in every situation. More than ever, our troubled world, which began the new Millennium with the spectre of terrorism and the tragedy of war, demands that Christians learn to experience the Eucharist as a great school of peace.

There's still a strong tendency in many of us to think of the Eucharist as something more or less private, a personal communion between Jesus and ourselves, an experience away from the troubles and sufferings and anxiety of our daily lives. But the Eucharist is a divine mystery which moves us to union and solidarity with all of humanity. The more deeply we enter into this celebration, the more we should be committed to bringing peace and justice to all the earth. And so we come back to our original question. How is our worship connected to our daily lives?

Is our life orientated towards community and sharing with those in need, or is it directed rather towards consuming and looking out only for ourselves? We need to answer this question in order to know if we are properly and genuinely celebrating the Eucharist. We cannot delude ourselves: by our mutual love and, in particular, by our concern for those in need we will be recognized as true followers of Christ. This will be the criterion by which the authenticity of our Eucharistic celebrations is judged." I pray that our breaking of the bread of life here, will lead us to share our lives and bread with those who need us to be there for them.

#### Finding God in Our Past

At what point in your life did you feel most strongly the presence of God? Have you ever felt God actively guiding you, the events and direction of your life? Have you ever wondered what your true and divine calling is in life? There are times in life when we can clearly feel and see God's presence in our lives. But there are also times when facing a tragedy, chaos or a major decision, we turn to God and search for his guidance and presence, but can't find him, can't hear his voice and feel his presence. What do we do in such moments and how can we discern his voice and guidance in our lives? As human beings, we carry within ourselves the image and like-

ness of God. Our souls covet and thirst for his presence and rely on his healing and restoring touch like the air we breathe and water we drink. Without him in our lives, our souls, joy and peace wither and fade.

The Church encourages us to revive and nurture the divine presence in our lives through a life of daily prayer, reading of the Holy Bible, acts of faith and love, participation in the liturgical life of our church, fasting, confession, communing to his life-giving Body and Blood, learning and reflection. Sometimes it is also very helpful to look for God, his guidance and voice in our past. When life does not make sense, look back for meaning and insight. When you can't hear his voice and find the answer to your prayers, look for them in your past. When you can't feel the guidance of the Lord in the events of your present life, look for it in your past. More often than we realize and see, God answers our prayers before we ask him and He shows us the way before we are lost. He heals us before we are wounded, carries us before we fall.
