PARISH MOTTO - 'THE BEST IS YET TO COME'

THE SOLEMNITY OF PENTECOST 28th of May 2023

Dear Parishioners and Friends of our parish, we are so happy that you could join us today to celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost.

Even if some of us don't want to admit our age - we all love birthdays. On birthdays we get to feel important and then, of course, there are those gifts. It's the rare person who doesn't like to receive a gift from someone else. On this, the birthday of the Church, we are asked to become more conscious of the gifts that we already have - gifts that the Spirit has given to us. Maybe some of you grew up in homes where your parents did not encourage you to really acknowledge your gifts. You may have been told that you really couldn't do anything right, or you were not allowed to do anything on your own because no one had any confidence in you.

These kinds of attitudes can be a terrible obstacle to developing any kind of trust in your own abilities. Sometimes we carry these attitudes into our adulthood. Our gifts lay in some dark closet and we never dare to go there. Our first step towards us-

ing those gifts for the good of God's world is to be aware of the gifts we do possess. As children we often either think that we have no gifts, or that we can do everything. A young person often needs the insight of someone older to help them to see the gifts they really do possess. We sometimes make the mistake of thinking that the only gifts of the Spirit are those that are somehow, as it were, inside the Church - gifts like preaching and teaching, or healing, or administration and so forth. But all good gifts come from the Holy Spirit, and all good gifts can be used to renew the face of the earth. St Pope John Paul II describes the Holy Spirit as "Person-love, the uncreated gift, who is the eternal source of every gift that comes from God" (Dominum et Vivificantem, 50). The Holy Spirit's activity is shown in the activities of those who are temples of the Holy Spirit. We see the working of the Spirit in the concrete lives of other members of the Church. The first thing that we are asked to do with our gifts after acknowledging them, is to be thankful for them.

Thankfulness - this eliminates all jealousy towards others who have different gifts. All gifts are to be cherished and we should not put one ahead of another, even though this may seem the natural thing to do. "If we live by the Spirit, let us also walk by the Spirit. Let us have no self-conceit, no provoking of one another, no envy of one another" (Galatians 5:25-26). Most of us have heard the famous expression: "All that is required for evil to triumph is for people of good will to do nothing. What a terrible indictment". We cannot allow this to be said about ourselves as followers of Christ. At this time in the history of our Church, it seems quite clear that we have to put much more emphasis on the gifts of all the members, not just the gifts of the ordained or the religiously professed members of the Church. At our Baptism we received the gift



of the Holy Spirit.

Have we allowed that Spirit to work within us, or have we been saying 'No' to the demands of that Spirit? Some of us here may be called to great things. We can't rule out that possibility. But most of us are called to use our gifts in our own local community. When we do that we allow the Holy Spirit to become more visible in our world. Today the Spirit is breathing over the universe in a new way. But God respects time and history-God works in and through our histories, and it is not yet the fullness of time for Christ to come again. This is still the Era of the Spirit. And we are still called just as the disciples were to get out of our locked rooms-to leave our fears of the future behind in the past, and to live with the boldness of the Spirit in the present. Lord, send out your Spirit and renew the face of the earth.

schools, in our parishes and in our Dioceses." Reacting to her appointment, Anne Marie Clements said: "I couldn't be happier about my new role at Justice & Peace Scotland. I was drawn to the post of Catholic Social Teaching Engagement Officer as it will give me the opportunity to highlight the connections between the human rights and social justice issues of today and our Catholic faith.

This is something that I place great value on personally, inspired by Jesus' Gospel message of love."
